The smokefree debate

Background

Over the last few years, the weight of evidence for serious risks to health from passive smoking has grown too great to ignore. This has led to an increased focus on the need to protect people from exposure to these risks in their workplaces, and an ever-growing number of countries have passed legislation to protect workers.

Between December 2004 and March 2005 the Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety carried out a consultation on *A healthier future: a twenty year vision for health and wellbeing in Northern Ireland*. One part of the consultation invited responses to the question of whether or not there should be new legislation to restrict smoking in certain places. There were 71,000 responses to this question, and 91% stated a preference for legislation to be introduced to ban smoking in all enclosed public places and workplaces.

In June 2005 the Minister for Health announced his intention to introduce some level of ban on smoking in public places, and said that the next step is to decide how far it will go. Final proposals are expected to be put forward in the autumn.

While there is evidence of considerable public support for a complete ban on smoking in workplaces and public places, there is a range of issues relating to the legislation which are of interest to different groups, including:

- the health risks of environmental tobacco smoke (ETS);
- the extent to which ETS can be controlled by ventilation and air-conditioning systems;
- how legislation might impact on health inequalities;
- the impact of smokefree legislation on business, in particular the hospitality industry, and on the economy;
- social and legislative issues around protecting the workforce.
