Social capital and its relationship to health

There is increasing interest in the effects of the social environment on health, and in the concept of social capital. This seminar seeks to define social capital and provides an opportunity to consider the relevance, potential and challenges it presents.

Aim

The event will aim to answer the following questions:

- What are the mechanisms by which social capital influences health?
- Does social capital add new insights into what we already know about the impact of social relations on health?
- Much of the debate on social capital assumes it is a positive concept, but are there costs as well as benefits?
- Can the concept of social capital suggest options for intervention or policy development?
- Can social capital explain health outcomes from local community-based work?
- Does the concept of social capital help us to understand how to improve health and reduce inequalities?
- What value is placed on social capital by stakeholders?

Format

Several key speakers will address the issues, and delegates will have an opportunity to discuss the main themes.

This seminar will be of interest to the community and health development sectors and those working in public health, regeneration, economic development, primary care, social inclusion and social services.
